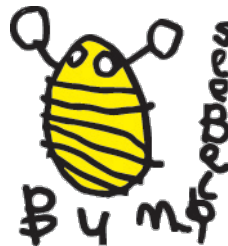
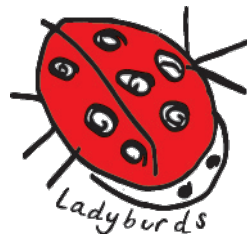

Baseline Assessment



At the start of the year: we will be 'Baseline Assessing' your child in the first 6 weeks.

This is part of the new Baseline Assessments being carried out in all schools from September 2020.

We will aim share the assessments with you and the next steps for learning this Baseline provides.

Assessment - The Early Years Foundation Stage Profile



The EYFS Profile is a way of summing up each child's progress and learning needs at the end of their first year at school.

It's based on the teachers on-going observations and assessments over the seven areas of learning. Children get awarded either **emerging**, **expected** or **exceeding** for each Early Learning Goal.

How you can support your child at school



- Open door policy in the morning
- Parent consultation Evenings
- Home learning/Reading records/Phonics Books
- Parent workshops - Curriculum support, e.g. Phonics and Reading
- All About Me Books, 'Wow' slips and Tapestry Observations.

Induction - prior to starting school



In place of our usual induction arrangements, this year we will share our presentations and a 'virtual tour' on the school website for you to share with your children until we can safely welcome you into school in person.

Year 6 Buddies will be allocated in September to support your child's transition into our school.

Pre-school providers and childminders have been consulted and will provide background information about the children to aid their transition.

Home visits will be arranged when guidance says it is safe to do so, giving you the chance to meet your class teacher and teaching assistant before your child starts school. We can then discuss any queries you may have in person.

Introduction - starting school

Assuming the guidance is that children can return normally to school in September:

Start School Full Time * 8.40am to 3.15pm	Monday 14th September

*Part Time provision is available and can be discussed with class teachers based on the needs of individuals (9.05am to 1.15pm each day)

Uniform for girls

Winter:
White shirt/blouse with a school tie
Grey trousers, culottes, skirt or pinafore dress
Grey tights, grey or white socks

Summer:
Green and white gingham dress (not striped)
White socks

NEW girls can now wear a white polo-shirt or blouse, and a grey skirt/culottes with white socks as summer uniform. Ties are not required.



Uniform for boys

Winter:
White shirt with a school tie
Long grey trousers (not black, please) or NEW boys can now wear shorts all year if they wish.
Grey or black socks

Summer:
Short sleeved, white polo shirt - ties are not required
Short grey school trousers
Grey or black socks

First Aid



We have trained First Aiders and Paediatric First Aiders working across the school.

If your child bumps their head at school you will receive a 'bumped head' letter at home time.

Please note:

We can only administer medication which has been prescribed. Forms are available in the entrance lobby by the main school office and on our website.

We will phone you if we have any concerns at all.

Poorly children

If your child is unwell or not able to get to school please inform the school office by 9.20am on the answer phone system (reporting an absence), then in person to the Class Teacher on your child's return.

We ask you to advise the school if your child has a contagious illness, such as mumps, German measles, Chicken Pox, Impetigo, etc.

The school has specific guidelines from the Local Authority with regards to exclusion times for specific illness, e.g. 48 hours after any sickness.

The latest guidance relating to isolation and symptoms of the Coronavirus will be shared with all our families before starting in September.

If you are at all unsure, please contact the school office and they will be able to advise you further.

It is vital that you keep us informed of any changes to your contact details - on occasion we may need to contact you urgently.

The school breakfast club is excellent value for money at £3.20 per session including a healthy breakfast for children who arrive before 8.00am. The Breakfast Club is very popular and numbers are limited. Booking is made via your ParentPay account and must be made two clear days in advance. Fees are non-refundable.

Children being dropped off for breakfast club can use the side gate to access the Hall. Please note that for security reasons this gate will be locked after 8.15am so any arrivals after this time will be via the school reception. Please advise the Breakfast Club Leader if your arrival will be after 8.15am.

School lunches



Freshly prepared lunch choices



Meals are freshly cooked each day on the premises and we will continue to participate in the Universal Free School Meal Offer. This means that all children in our Reception, Year One and Year Two classes have a meal provided by school each day.

There is a choice between a hot main meal (**red meal**), vegetarian (**green meal**) or a packed lunch option (**blue meal**), along with a selection of desserts each day. Lunches need to be booked two days in advance via your ParentPay account. If you don't make a selection by then, your child's lunch defaults to the red meal option.

Once your child is settled we have a 'family lunch' available on a Tuesday and Wednesday which you can pre-book. This is available from the October Half Term.
